

## Worship and Music Report 2021

Covid-19 brought changes to our Sunday worship service. We now attend in person, wearing masks, or join the congregation by computer and "livestreaming." Thanks to Dick Stephens and his tech crew, Mary Johnson, Sheryl Crankshaw, Jim Wilson and Patti Stephens, many people have been able to receive our service. On January 10<sup>th</sup> our congregation had the joy of being led in worship by Summer Sattora, as she candidated with hopes of being our pastor. She was unanimously approved. Summer's first Sunday as our spiritual leader was February 14<sup>th</sup>. Until then we were blessed with Sunday service leadership of Rev. Gail Parsons, Linya Bell, Patti Stephens, Rev. Marti Montovani and Rev. Adele Spencer.

We remembered the Crucifixion on April 2<sup>nd</sup> at 7:00 PM, with a Communion and Tenebrae service.

On Easter Sunday, April 4<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 AM, we joined in an Ecumenical Sunrise service at the Battlefield. At our 10:00 AM service, memory flowers added joy to our celebration of our risen Lord.

On May 23<sup>rd</sup>, Summer initiated the use of lay liturgists into our service. Sixteen members and friends have served. We even had a former pastor, Rev. Scott Barton, participate at the invitation of John Deans.
